World's Largest Continuous Dinosaur Trackway

This site, the West Gold Hill Dinosaur Track site, is now on public land, so anyone can visit it! Thanks to the US Forest Service, which was able to buy the land, the Charles family, who owned the land and were willing to sell it so the public could see it, and many fossil trackway experts and local volunteers, the site has been carefully studied and is now protected. This photo, courtesy of the Smithsonian Institution, shows the trackway.



Located above Ouray, Colorado, the tracks were made about 150 million years ago by a fairly small Sauropod dinosaur, a type of four-legged dinosaur with long necks and tails. The trackway is rare because it shows the dinosaur doing a "180" turn and because it has 134 footprints, making it the longest continuous dinosaur trackway in the world! The tracks are in a Jurassic formation that in our area is called the Tidwell, formed way before the Rocky Mountains pushed the area up. Then glaciers scoured off some of the rocks over it, exposing the tracks.

However, to see the trackway requires a tough, steep climb from Ouray to the site 1600 feet higher, on a trail called the Silvershield Trail. You need to be in pretty decent shape to make the climb. Local geologist and former running world-record holder Rick Trujillo grew up in Ouray and knew about the tracks, and then Fort Lewis College student Zane Goodell wrote his thesis on the trackway.

A team of fossil trackway experts was led by the former Dr. Martin Lockley, world-famous trackway expert, and Dr. Bruce Schumacher, a Forest Service paleontologist who has spearheaded the preservation of the Picketwire trackway in southeast Colorado. Joined by other local paleontologists and volunteers, including a couple of Grand Junction Rock Club members, they oversaw the uncovering of the largest part of the trackway that had been hidden under dirt and vegetation.

After many hours of careful sweeping, measuring, and documenting the trackway, scientists could tell that the animal was about a meter tall and traveling at roughly 2.5 km/hr. As the Forest Service's Schumacher says, "It's this amazing geologic story" that resulted in the tracks being exposed where they are.

Speaker: Rex Cole, Emeritus Prof. Of Geology, CMU. Grand Mesa Geoscience Education, LLC. A presentation on the Geology of Grand Mesa, Colorado.
